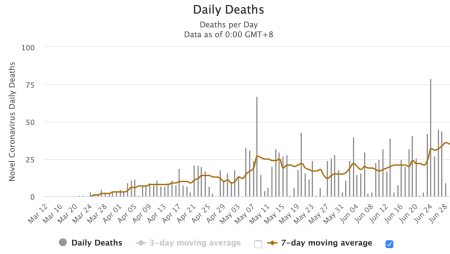

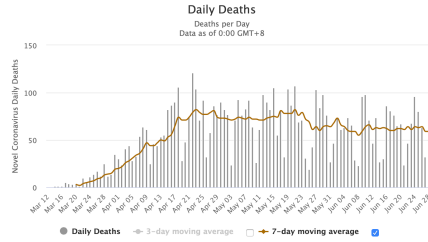

SOUTHERN STATES = FLAT CURVES

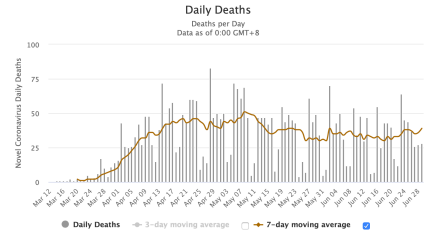
Daily New Deaths in Arizona



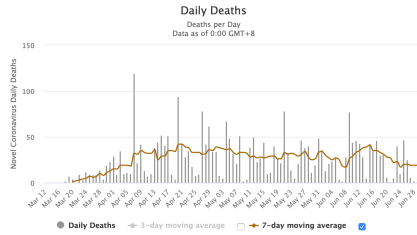
Daily New Deaths in California



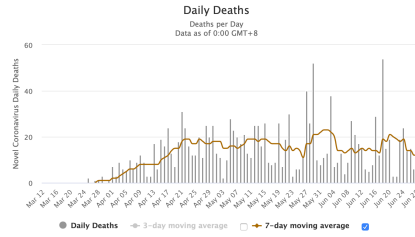
Daily New Deaths in Florida



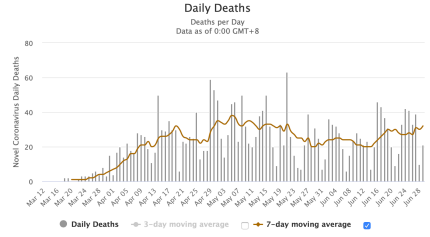
Daily New Deaths in Georgia



Daily New Deaths in North Carolina

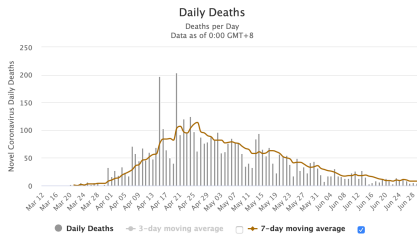


Daily New Deaths in Texas

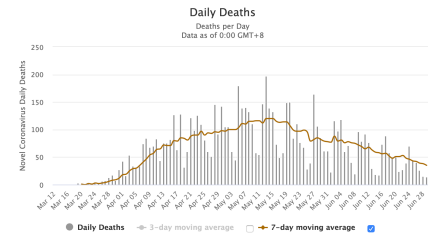


NORTHERN STATES = TYPICAL SIR RISE & FALL CURVES

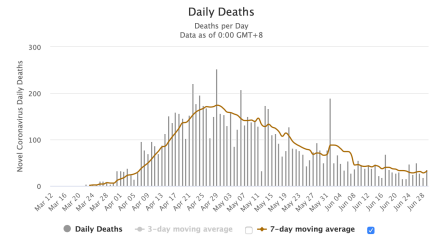
Daily New Deaths in Connecticut



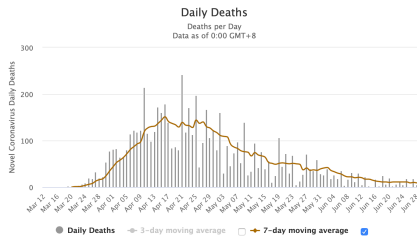
Daily New Deaths in Illinois



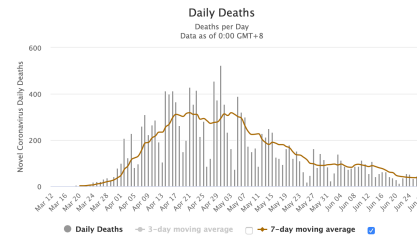
Daily New Deaths in Massachusetts



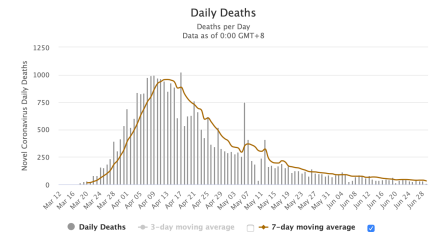
Daily New Deaths in Michigan

One might say that these graphs prove that lethality of COVID-19 is tied to latitude. The data proves it to be true.

This paper will meander through truths, attribution, and causality. There are many papers and studies that tie things together as mere coincidences or perhaps distant cousins in a causality chain.

Causality is important in order to understand and potentially thwart spread. News media have been creating narratives for each of the poles - the LEFT Pole and the RIGHT pole - instead of objectively reporting data without false causality pathways.

INTRODUCTION

The states of Connecticut, Illinois, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Jersey, and New York all appear to have similar graphs that begin with an outbreak in March 2020, rise quickly to a peak, then slowly diminish over a few months to a low level.

Interestingly, the low level that the northern states have fallen to is not far below the steady state level that the southern states have held at for months. And if you look at the months of the northern states, you'll notice that it has become warm in the late spring and early summer months.

CAUSALITY TRAP AGAIN

Where is the proof? Why haven't CDC and NIAID completed studies on environmental conditions and their effects on COVID-19? They don't provide much useful information besides a website on how to sew a homemade mask. There is no proof masks have any net positive efficacy. If they performed studies on efficacy of masks, that would be useful. They haven't. If they authored pandemic mitigation plans, it would be useful. Obviously, they haven't. The CDC and NIAID have been winging this the whole time. Fauci has been guessing. And he's been wrong almost every time. Yet people still listen to him and call him a leading expert.

Here's another challenge to causality. What if its not weather, but rather a difference in how people move about in the north versus the south? If you look at the transportation systems of the cities in the north that have had dire outbreaks, you'll notice that they all have commuter rail and subway systems that get utilized en masse. They have tall buildings in which people ride elevators and touch the same buttons and handrails.

In the southern states, people live differently than in the north. Southerners commute more by private automobile. Their parking lots are

outdoors. They walk outside more. Handrails and buttons are often in direct sunlight. The lifestyle in the south is different.
